### **Course Description:**

### - Introductory Course of Japanese Language and Culture

This class is aimed at those who have no or almost no knowledge of the Japanese language, and who wish to see what kind of language Japanese is without serious commitment. It contains lessons of Japanese characters, basic grammatical and conversational exercises based on a topic-based syllabus. It lasts for only one year and doesn't continue to 2nd level class. Certification of attendance will be issued at the end of the year. If the student wishes, it is possible for them to transfer to the regular course.

#### -Main Course

- The student must commit to take the course seriously.
- The certification will be issued to students who attended classes throughout the academic year (both 1st and 2nd semesters). Your score (A-E) evaluated by attendance/activity/test marks etc. will be included on the certificate.
- The student must check his/her email throughout the duration of the course.

## Level 1 class

This class is aimed at those who have no or almost no knowledge of the Japanese language, and wish to acquire the language skills, or experience the language on a deeper level. By the end of the course, through learning basic speaking, listening, writing and reading skills, students will be able to: read and write Japanese basic letters: Hiragana and Katakana, as well as basic Kanji characters; engage in short spoken discourse about everyday topics; and use basic Japanese structures and expressions in a given context.

#### Level 2 class

This class is for those who have completed the GENKI-1 textbook Chapters 1–8, or have equivalent knowledge of Japanese. It covers basic grammar, and Kanji characters. By the end of the course, students will be able to engage in spoken discourse on everyday topics at a deeper level and in a wider context.

#### Level 3 class

This level is for those who have completed the GENKI-1 textbook and GENKI-2 Ch.13-16, or have equivalent knowledge of Japanese (approx. JLPT N5 level). More expressions and vocabulary will be covered, and the focus will be on academic rather than conversational skills, although verbal communication skills will also be enhanced. GENKI-2 will be used in the first semester, and "TOBIRA" will be used in the second semester as an intermediate level Japanese textbook.

#### Level 4 class

This level is for those who have completed the textbooks GENKI-1, 2 and "TOBIRA" Ch 1–3, or have equivalent knowledge of Japanese (approx. JLPT N4 level). It covers more grammar and advanced vocabulary, with advanced communication skills as its focus.

#### Advanced class

This level is for those who have completed Level 4 class of the course, or have equivalent knowledge to JLPT N3 level. "TOBIRA" will be used in the first semester, and real articles such as news, web articles, short novels etc. will be used for the second semester, covering advanced grammar and vocabulary, with advanced communication skills as its focus.

#### **Events and activities:**

# 1. Japanese Calligraphy Contest

This event is annually held in January. Participants will learn basic calligraphy and create their work using real Japanese calligraphy tools. The best works will be awarded by the Faculty of Philosophy and the Embassy of Japan.







# 2. Japanese Speech Contest

This event is annually held in March. Participants have a chance to voice their opinions to an audience in Japanese. It is divided into two sections: Beginner and Intermediate. The best speeches will be awarded by the Faculty of Philosophy and the Embassy of Japan.





## 3. Presentation Day

This event is held annually at the end of the course (usually in June or beginning of July). Participants will make group presentations to introduce local culture to a Japanese audience in Japanese. Sometimes, students chose to get creative and hold demonstrations (e.g. baklava tasting), poetry reading or theatre play adaptations in Japanese, adjusted to their level with the help of their teacher or upperclassmen, and the teamwork of the group.



# 4. Yukata Workshop

The course provides more cultural workshops such as the Yukata (a summer variation of Kimono) workshop. We are open to any suggestions to expand on our activities!



## 5. Nihongo no Kai

There is a monthly gathering over coffee, tea and snacks with Japanese people called "Nihongo no Kai", where you have a chance to use your Japanese skills in a casual conversation with real Japanese, adjusted to your level! Sometimes, traditional Japanese food and snacks, as well as games, are showcased (it is held online during the pandemic).

## 6. School Visit Project

We are visiting elementary schools and high schools to promote Japanese culture to younger generations. The project is conducted with volunteers from Japanese Language Course.
